# Skill Development Camp

A five-day residential skill development camp (Orientation & Mobility, Daily Living Skills) for visually impaired people was organised on December 22-26, 2015 at *Gadi Lohar School* Chittorgarh with the participation of 30 visually impaired people including five female members for enabling them to carry out day-to-day activities with least possible external assistance



# **Vocational Trainings for Disabled Class**

Two vocational trainings were organised at Keli, Ghatiyawali Tehsil in Chittorgarh for physically challenged people on making detergent, dish washing soap, washing powder, phenyl etc. Lalit Jaroli, resource person from Sankalp Credit Cooperative Society Ltd. facilitated the training to around 40 participants. In continuation to this other one and half month tailoring training was conducted at Bassi for 15 physically challenged participants. Uttam Singh Shekhawat Sub-Divisional Magistrate; Praveen Singh Rathore *Pradhan, Panchayat Samiti*, Chittorgarh; V Chandrashekhar Branch Manager, State Bank of Bikaner and Jaipur and Anju Kanwar, *Sarpanch*, Bassi were the eminent guests of the event. An exposure visit was

also made on the last day at IL & FS Vocational Training Centre, Bhilwara and certificates were provided to the participants on successful completion of training.

# Study for Physical Barriers of PwDs

A study on accessibility was conducted to know the challenges faced by People with Disabilities (PwDs) in all important government buildings and public facilities involving 15 DPO members, Rajasthan Social Inclusion Programme (RSIP) staff and representatives from ARUSHI, a consultant agency from Bhopal. During the study the obstacles for PwDs at accessing public facilities were identified and later a study on the same was shared with the concerned departments to sensitise the service providers to create favourable environment for them.

# Welfare Camps

Three welfare camps was organised with help of (DSoJ & E). Ved Prakash District Collector-Chittorgarh; OP Toshniwal, Deputy Director SJ & E; Praveen Rathore *Pradhan* of *Panchayat Samiti;* Chand Kriplani MLA, Nimbahera; Hemendra Naagar, State District Magistrate and Anil Pahadiya, Block Development Officer, Nimbahera attended the camps in their areas, where about 15 DPOs were benefitted by getting allotted nine tricycles, four white canes, five crutches, six disability certificates, two pension benefit, three *Sukhad Dampatya Yojana*, five *Mukhyamantri Swarojgar Yojana*. On this occasion, *Mewar Viklang Sewa Sansthan* (DPO) was appreciated by District Collector Chittorgarh for its incredible contribution in the welfare of disabled people.

Under the social inclusion programme, about nine posters developed were unveiled by CP Joshi, Member of Parliament, Chittorgarh; Chandrabhaan Singh Akyaa, Member of Legislative Assembly and OP Toshniwal in welfare camp held at SJ & E. In the opening session, Gauhar elucidated about the role of posters in social inclusion programme. The guests were impressed to see the posters with inspiring messages for the upliftment of disabled people. As part of the programme, nearly 127 disabled got benifitted by acquiring various aids meant for the physically challenged group like tricycles, crutches, wheelchairs, hearing aid devices, rollato prosthetic limbs etc.

# Signature Campaign under Road Safety Week

Road Safety Week was observed by CHD and DPO in collaboration with Regional Office of Transport Department, Chittorgarh on the theme of road safety 'Time for Action' to spread awareness on road safety issues at village-level. Two wheeler drivers were urged to wear good quality helmet to protect themselves whereas four wheeler drivers were recommended to use seat belt while driving. Over 600 people participated in signature campaign giving the assurance to follow the traffic rules to avoid fatalities. In Bhilwara, an Open House was organised at the Control Office of Traffic Police on 'Road Safety Week' where around 150 children and community people were provided relevant information about the road safety.

month's training in tailoring for 102 Self-help Groups (SHGs) women for was conducted at *Mandal* and *Bagore* block of Bhilwara with the objective to develop model SHGs by providing training in all aspects of SHGs. This included sensitising about the SHG concept, developing regular saving habit among the SHG's members, maintaining records, developing leadership qualities and ensuring additional income for each SHG member by adoption of income generation activities.
