Promoting Organic Consumption in Rajasthan

In Promoting Organic Consumption in Rajasthan (ProOrganic II) project, the focus is on sustainable food and farming and formulating an agenda to achieve it. This will be achieved by promoting organic production of farm products, on the one hand, and promoting organic consumption on the other. Consequently, this would lead to sustainable development in the agricultural and environmental sectors.

Awareness Workshop

A District-level Awareness Workshop was held at Pratapgarh on November 16, 2021. Yogesh Kanojia and Damor, Scientists, Krishi Vigyan Kendra; Gopal Yogi, Agriculture Officer; and Mangi Lal Janwa, progressive farmer were resource persons. They shared organic farming methods, preparation of biopesticides and vermin-culture compost,



maintaining the level of soil capacity in terms of production and techniques, which reduces the overall farming costs. More than 65 participants attended the event.

Farmers Training and Exposure Visits



District level Farmer's training and exposure visits were held at Pratapgarh and Chittorgarh districts of Rajasthan On November 23-24, 2021. O P Sharma, Deputy Director (Agriculture); and Rajaram Sukhwal, Deputy Director (Horticulture); were resource persons. Progressive organic farmers across the district made an exposure visit at Nirmal Farm, Jai Singh Pura, where they saw the practical work on vermin compost unit, vermin wash, and other multi crops organic farming and were interested in adopting it. More than 116 farmers participated.

Showcasing Organic Products

Organic fairs were organised at Chittorgarh and Pratpagarh districts on November 02 & 15, 2021. The aim is to showcase and popularise the organic products by local farmers who switch from chemical to organic farming.



The progressive farmers and consumers shared their achievements, challenges and the way forward in promoting organic farming.

More than 600 participants represented different ethnic groups, farming communities, private entrepreneurs, and consumers from all over the blocks who participated in the event.

Media Workshop

Media workshops were held at Chittorgarh and Pratapgarh districts of Rajasthan, on November 15 & December 02, 2021 respectively. George Cheriyan, Director, CUTS, provided a brief overview of the role of media in promoting the consumption of organic farming. Raja Ram Sukhwal, Deputy Director, Horticulture, remarked on the media's reactions to the need for organic farming in the current perspective.

Madan Giri Goswami and some progressive farmers highlighted the project's outcomes and narrated successful field stories. More than 44 media persons attended.

The training was imparted to participants to reuse, regenerate clothes, plastic, etc. This campaign will bring equal and sustainable access to goods and services for the people to benefit. A total of 85 persons attended.

Prevention of Child Labour Programme

he programme commenced in Limbodi and Kataro Ka Kheda of Pratapgarh district. The following activities will be carried out:

- forming and strengthening village-level child protection committees to ensure an inclusive and accessible community;
- interface with District Child Protection Unit, Special Juvenile Police Units, children groups, establishing community-based tracking system to capture timely interventions, response and rehabilitate affected children;
- creating a safe and nurturing environment;
- leveraging with social security and welfare schemes;
- raising awareness among the general public on the issue of child rights;
- creating social accountability among stakeholders;
- sensitising parents on the importance of education and child rights; enrolling children out of schools;
- providing vocational training to adolescent youth; and
- promoting and providing livelihoods options on the farm, non-farm and off-farm with their families.

George Cheriyan, Gauhar Mahmood and Madan Giri Goswami visited the Limbodi and Kataro ka Kheda villages on December 02, 2021, to see the ground reality. They met with community members and representatives to introduce the project objectives and expected outcomes.
